

CAMP CODE OF CONDUCT

Pack 911 through its Outing's/Safety committee takes this opportunity to welcome you to our upcoming Camp-Out event. For everyone's Safety, Please observe the following:

THE SCOUT OATH AND LAW WILL BE THE LAW OF THE CAMP

Gambling, alcoholic beverages, smoking, illegal drugs, pets, fireworks, firearms, slingshots, bows and arrows and other propellant devices are not permitted in the Camp Area.

1. Parents are responsible for the supervision of their own children.
2. The use of Profanity (cussing or swearing) is not allowed by anyone at camp.
3. Riding in the back of pick-up trucks, on the outside of cars or trailers is not allowed. Use normal passenger vehicles and avoid overcrowding.
4. Obey the 15 MPH speed limit when you must drive in or near camp.
5. Parents & Webelos w/adult supervision build cooking and campfires only in established fire areas. When finished with any fire, be sure it is completely out. Do not leave a fire unattended. Must have a full water bucket near each fire.
6. Do not ever use liquid fuels for fire starting.
7. All Scouting activities will be conducted on a smoke-free basis (**all tobacco products**), with smoking areas located off camp premises well away from all youth participants.
8. Do not bring pets/animals to any Pack organized camp-out.
9. We need every tree and shrub that we have. Good Scouts will see that these are not hacked or cut down for any purpose.
10. Do not carve your initials or deface the live trees, they belong to everybody.
11. Be a good neighbor. Unless you receive an invitation to enter, stay out of all other tents and other family campsites.
12. Do not borrow anything without prior agreement from owner of the item.
13. All Cub Scout Campers and siblings must be in their tent and quiet between the hours of 10:00 pm and 7:00 am. Allowing for nine hours of recharging.
14. **Sleeping arrangements** – Boys can only sleep with their own family or other boys without any parents in the tent. Adult co-ed may share a tent only if married.
15. Shoes (not sandals) must be worn in camp at all times to prevent cut feet or puncture wounds, which could result in costly and painful medical services.
16. Events involving swimming: Females need to wear a one-piece swimsuit. If they do not have one, a shirt must be worn over their swimsuit.
17. LEAVE NO TRACE – Help protect the environment by remembering that while you are there, you are a visitor. Please leave everything just as you find it.
18. A Class 1 Medical Health Form must be on file for everyone prior to attending camp.

The Camp Staff will assist you in anyway they can and also answer any questions you might have regarding your stay in camp.
