

Cub Scout Pack 911 Family Camp Out March 29 & 30

Destination: Bluff Landing Campsite, aprox. 12.5 miles East on 71st from Elm in Broken Arrow. Watch for 'Bluff Landing' sign on left side of the road to turn on. If you end up at Newt Graham Lock and Damn (dead-end), you went too far. Once you cross over cattle guard entrance to Park, stay to the right and you will come up to Field with the bathrooms, Kid's Park and Pavilion. We have permission to camp in the Field across the street from the Pavilion. Our Camp opens Saturday morning @ 10 am. There are only about 4 'Fire Rings' in this area if you need them for cooking. Meals will not be provided so please bring something to eat for lunch, dinner, and breakfast Sunday. The Pack will however provide stuff for Smores Saturday night. With this many people attending, you will need to bring camp chairs to sit on. Another 'Fire Ring' will be used for the Closing Campfire activities starting around 8 pm. It is highly recommended that if you plan on doing any cooking to please use a Coleman Stove or other portable means rather than building a 'live' fire on the ground (which not using a pre-existing fire ring is also against the Park Policy).

During "activity times", the boys with their parent may choose to do something else like nature walks or resting or just playing. The Service Project (limb collection at a predetermined location per Corps of Engineers Dept) and Closing Campfire will be mandatory attendance times for all Scouts to attend and participate. **BSA Policy** asks that If you smoke or use tobacco products, you need to be out of the regular camp site area and well out of site of any scout campers. Also a 'No Profanity ' policy, swearing or cussing, will be in effect at the Camp. Parents: At all times the '**BUDDY SYSTEM**' is to be followed with all Scouts, either a scout with a scout or a scout with a family member. No Scouts going off camp site or out of regular view of an adult without a Buddy or Buddies. If parents can bring a couple of pieces of firewood for the closing campfire, that would be much appreciated.

Immediately after arriving on site, 1 adult from each family needs to please check in at the Pavilion with Jeremy Willis. He will be collecting everybody's Class I Health Forms. Everyone attending camp will need to have one filled out, that means scouts, siblings, adults, everyone. If you have not already turned yours in, here is a link to print one off. Please fill it out prior to

arriving at camp. If you have not signed up and still want to attend, please contact Jeremy Willis at either 630-5799 or e-mail at scase15@aol.com. Please include scout name and number attending. Also please review the attached Camp Code of Conduct.
